### **Links with Local Schools**

Porthcawl U3A has in recent times been developing strong links with our local Comprehensive School by, for example, inviting students to take part in our Conversation (Discussion) Group sessions, or inviting students to sing at social events, and we, in turn, have attended their drama productions. We and the School are very keen to further these links, and one way we can do this is by giving the senior students interview practice.

The students are at a stage in their lives when they will be facing interviews for higher education or employment. Many of us have been both interviewers or interviewees in our working lives and have acquired skills which we can pass on to the young people. Interviewers from the outside world, rather than their teachers, will make the experience more 'real', and follow-up feedback will give the students valuable guidance as to how they can present themselves to maximum advantage.

The Head of the Sixth Form suggests that the students most likely to benefit from the mock interviews are those in Year 12 (First Year Sixth) and the most suitable time will be the second half of the summer term, i.e.mid June to mid July, when they will have taken their As Level exams. The School will provide guidance for interviewers.

## Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> April: Visit to the Nature in Art Museum and Gloucester Cathedral

The coach for this visit will leave the Atlantic Hotel at 8.30am and Sainsbury's Bridgend at 8.50am (approx). Although nature has been an important stimulus to human creativity for many thousands of years, it was not until the opening of the Nature in Art Museum in 1988 that art inspired by nature was exclusively collected, displayed and celebrated by any museum in this country or abroad. The collection has now grown to include works by over 600 artists from more than 50 countries, embracing a wide range of styles and media and providing wonderful opportunities for inspiration and learning. After lunch together we'll go on to Gloucester Cathedral, which was founded as an Anglo Saxon Religious House in 678 AD, By the Norman Conquest it had become a monastery and the buildings were improved and extended over the following centuries. The monastery was dissolved in 1541 when it was designated a Cathedral and the seat of the Bishop of Gloucester. Today it houses magnificent stained glass windows and sculptures and exemplifies a Medieval, Romanesque and Perpendicular architectural styles.

# Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> May: Visit to the Samtampa Commemoration Event at the Senedd, Cardiff The coach for this visit will leave the Atlantic at 10am and Sainsbury's at 10.20am (approx.)

This event is being organised by Porthcawl Shout Forum to commemorate the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the awful tragedy which occurred at Sker Point in April 1947, causing the deaths of the entire crews of the Samptampa itself and of the Mumbles Lifeboat. The First Minister, Carwyn Jones, and the Mayors of Porthcawl and Mumbles will be present at this Commemoration Event, and there will be contributions from school pupils, students and community groups. These will include choral and folk singing, story-telling, poetry, personal reflections and art exhibitions. Although this is a Commemoration Event it will also be a celebration of courage and endeavour – one which we will enjoy and one that is truly deserving of our support. There is no charge for admission but the coach fare is £9 per person.
