In fact, higher rate tax payers benefit from making the declaration. You are entitled to tick the YES box if you do pay tax, but many members do not realise they are paying tax because it has been deducted at source, for example on an occupational income or on investments. If you are in doubt please contact me. I will not enquire into your circumstances.
