Wednesday 4th October – 2.15p.m. at the Hi-Tide Talk by John Laver FRAS, M. INST. P. – Global Warming – Myth or Monster?

Global warming is very much in the news, with the fact of its existence, its causes and consequences brought constantly into question. FURTHER LINKS WITH PORTHCAWL COMPREHENSIVE SCHOOL

Following on from the highly successful U3A/PCS event last June, when 18 of our members went into the school to give the sixth formers interview experience, we have now been approached to see if we can help the younger pupils with some of their numeracy work.
