The formal summer examinations started this week, and this morning over 200 Year 11 pupils sat their GCSE Welsh 2nd Language examination paper. We wish all Year 10, Year 11, Year 12, and Year 13 pupils the very best for their summer examinations.

I am sure that all Year 11, Year 12, and Year 13 families have received my previous letters which included details about study leave, so by means of a brief update:

• Year 11: Study Leave will be granted from the week commencing 5th June 2023 and until this date, students will be expected to attend school as normal. Students will attend lessons and revise and prepare

accordingly. Students will sit examinations as usual then return to lessons. For the next two weeks a bespoke revision programme has been put in place to support all students. We have the leavers assembly to look forward to soon.

- Year 12: Normal teaching finishes today, Friday 12th May. Monday 15th May is the first AS examination paper and Monday 5th June is the date of the last AS examination paper. Students will not be expected to attend normal lessons during this period unless their teacher requests it. On Monday, 12th June, all students should attend school for the Year 13 Induction Programme in the Sixth Form Hall. All students must attend, there is a lot planned this year and the induction programme has been designed to support the move from AS to A2.
- Year 13: Lessons continue until Friday 19th May. Monday 22nd May is the first A Level paper and Friday 23rd June is the date of the last A Level examination paper. I am sure all are looking forward to the Sixth Form Summer Ball on Friday 7th July and our Leavers' Ceremony on Friday 19th May.
