Dear Parents / Carers,

Warmer Weather

As you will be aware, for a few days of this week we have experienced temperatures above the seasonal average, with today being the last day of the 'higher' temperatures. During this time, I have regularly reviewed the daily and long-term weather forecasts from the BBC and the Met Office and the forecast from Friday 2nd May onwards suggests that daily temperatures in Porthcawl will return to what we would expect for this time of year. As we move into next week, I can see that temperatures will return to 18-16 degrees with lower UV levels and a lower 'feels like' temperature (showing as 13-14 degrees on some days).

For information:

- There is no summer uniform at Porthcawl Comprehensive School. Pupils will continue to wear their normal school shirts and ties but will not need to wear their pullovers/jumpers. This is the only change to uniform during this period with all other items remaining the same.
- If temperatures were to increase to an uncomfortable level for a long period of time, I will write to let you know what adjustments will be put in place you will be contacted via ClassCharts. If a temporary adjustment, such as wearing PE kit was put in place, this would be a short-term measure and it would only last for the period of excessive temperatures. Please note, this adjustment is not in place at this time, and I will continue to monitor the weather forecasts as we move through the summer term.
- Pupils should be encouraged to bring water bottles/water to school. We have a number of water dispensers located at various points around our school site making it easy for pupils to refill their bottles during the day at break and lunchtime.
- During break and lunchtime, pupils spend time outside and may wish to bring a hat/sun cream. Our school site is a large site, and many pupils enjoy the field space and the surrounding areas/facilities, therefore a hat/sun cream is advised.

As we know, forecasts can remain or change quickly, so with this in mind, during the summer term, if the weather turned warmer for a longer period of time, as per our policy I will write to you with regards to any temporary changes to uniform outlining any adjustments.
