Carnegie Centre of Excellence for Mental Health in Schools - Gold Award

At the start of the academic year we were awarded the Carnegie Mental Health Gold Award in recognition of our excellent 'whole school' approach to mental health and wellbeing provision. Mental health and wellbeing are at the heart of our school community; we value emotional wellbeing and caring for one another as much as academic success. I continue to be very proud of our outstanding 'whole school approaches' which involve pupils, staff,

governors and several professional partners. At PCS, we are committed to creating an ethos which puts mental health and wellbeing at the forefront of what we do and the achievement of this award is not just recognition of our excellent whole-school approach to mental health, it is a recognition of our commitment to improving the life chances of our pupils whilst also highlighting the excellent work we are doing to promote mental health for the children and adults in our community.



Cyber First - Gold Award

During the autumn term, we also celebrated achieving the Cyber First Gold Award for recognition to delivering excellence in cyber security education. We are one of a few schools and colleges in Wales to receive this award which is led by the National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC) – part of GCHQ. This award recognised our whole school commitment and dedication to delivering excellence in cyber education. We have an excellent computing and digital curriculum at PCS, and I am proud to say we are able to offer a specialist experiences to our pupils – there will be lot's planned in 2025-2026!



Estyn Interim Visit

In the autumn term we received an "Interim Visit" from Estyn. This interim inspection visit focussed on two of the recommendations from our previous Core Inspection and centred around teaching & learning and self-evaluation. We were particularly pleased that the inspection team noted:

- The substantial amount of work undertaken by senior leaders to revise processes for self-evaluation and planning for improvement;
- How senior leaders have collaborated with staff to develop a set of pedagogical principles to improve consistency and create a culture of high-quality teaching and learning;
- How our team of teaching and learning champions have developed useful resources, such as the teaching and learning toolkit, to support teachers in developing their practice;
- How leaders support departments helpfully to provide pupils with opportunities to develop their literacy skills across the curriculum;
- That our self-evaluation and planning for improvement work has a stronger focus on learning and teaching;
- That teachers are supported to improve their practice with a helpful professional learning offer, which includes useful support material for developing teaching; and
- How the 'Porthcawl Pedagogical Principles' provides a beneficial framework for evaluation and is helping teachers to develop a shared understanding of the school's strategic approach to teaching and learning.

We will continue to develop and improve all that we do, to ensure the very best for the pupils at Porthcawl Comprehensive School.

School improvement is a continuous journey and is one that staff at PCS are committed to!

School Results

In the spring term 2025, the Welsh Government published our summer 2024 school performance data via the "My Local School" website. I continue to be very pleased with our pupils' performance, and our national performance in Literacy, Numeracy, Science and the Skills Challenge Certificate was excellent! The school's performance in Numeracy (top 9%) and Science (top 7%) placed the school in the top 10% of secondary schools nationally. The school's performance in Literacy placed the school in the top 5% nationally. School results are one measure of our success, and I would like to thank all pupils and staff for their hard work, effort and commitment and I am sure more success awaits in 2025-2026.
