Dear Parents/Carers,

At the start of the new term, I would like to provide you with an update of news from Porthcawl Comprehensive School. As per last year, please treat this letter as a start of term 'Headteacher Newsletter' as I reflect on recent achievements and outline some important information for the year ahead. I encourage you to read and refer to this letter during the weeks ahead.

Firstly, I hope you have all had an enjoyable summer with family and friends, and that your child is looking forward to the new term ahead. At this time of year, we welcome new families, and I hope that this is the start of a positive relationship together. I wrote to you in July to provide you with some details about arrangements for the start of term and the academic year ahead, my intention now is to provide you with updated information on these plans.

Examination Results

Once again, I was delighted with this summer's GCSE and A Level examination results, and I would like to congratulate all pupils in last year's Yr11 and Yr13 on their outstanding achievements. It gives me a real sense of pride seeing the young people in our community rewarded for their hard work. Overall, our pupils have received an outstanding set of results which will ensure they move on to the next phase of their education and lives. Throughout their time at PCS, they have all shown such commitment and determination. I would like to also congratulate the dedicated staff and our families for their hard work and continued support – a sincere thank you.

<u>Summer 2025 A Level Results – Success!</u>

We are very proud of the outcomes achieved by our Yr13 pupils. Nearly 90% of all grades awarded were A*-C, almost 70% were A*-B and around 45% were A*-A. Approximately three-quarters of pupils achieved three or more A Levels graded at A*-C and 25% of pupils achieved three or more A Levels graded at A*-A grades. In addition, nearly all pupils achieved the Level 3 Threshold. Summer 2025 GCSE Results - More Success!

The school's GCSE results were once again very good - we are delighted with our pupil's achievements! Our provisional results show that a high percentage of pupils achieved five or more GCSEs graded A*-C including English Language and Mathematics. Over 80% of all GCSE grades were awarded at A*-C, 35% of pupils achieved five or more GCSEs graded at A*-A and most importantly all pupils left school with a range of recognised qualifications.

In 2025, we have once again maintained strong contextual points scores in Literacy, Numeracy and Science, and our Capped 9 points score (a student's best nine GCSEs including English Language and Mathematics) continues to be

positive; demonstrating our commitment to maximising the highest grades for all pupils. Provisional figures released by the examination board suggest that in English Language and Mathematics our school's A*-A, A*-B and A*-C pass rates are significantly higher than local, regional and national averages. Everyone at PCS is incredibly proud of all Yr11 pupils!

We are also really pleased that a high number of pupils have chosen to return to the Sixth Form at PCS. In Yr12, we also welcome several new pupils from other schools, and I wish them and our new families a warm PCS welcome. Our Sixth Form numbers are now approximately 280 pupils for the 2025-2026 academic year.

Summer 2025 GCSE Results - Even More Success!

Our Year 10 pupils also completed a small number of GCSEs papers, and their performance has been excellent too! There were some very strong module results in Biology, Chemistry and Physics. In addition, nearly all pupils completed the full GCSE in English Literature with 90% achieving a grade A*-C, 76% achieving a grade A*-B and 44% achieving A*-A. Alongside English Literature, a large proportion of pupils also completed their GCSE Mathematics qualification with 100% achieving A*-C and almost 70% of pupils securing an A*-A grade. These results will provide an excellent foundation for Year 11 – my sincere congratulations to all pupils and the English, Mathematics and Science Faculties.

I look forward to more success from all pupils in summer 2026!

The Curriculum for Porthcawl

The national Curriculum for Wales outlines its 'Four Purposes of Education', enabling learners to become: ambitious and capable learners; enterprising and creative contributors; ethical and informed citizens and healthy and confident individuals. These purposes inform the design of our own, bespoke curriculum, marrying them with the individual ambitions, interests and potential of every pupil at Porthcawl. We believe that our responsibility under the Four Purposes is to "provide all pupils with the knowledge, skills, experiences and desire to thrive in the adult world". This is our **Curriculum Vision**. The curriculum we have designed supports our young people to develop as the 'Porthcawl Pupil'. These are the attributes and 'wants' we aim to develop with all pupils across the school community.

The 'Porthcawl Pupil' underpins:

- What we, as a school community, <u>believe</u> is important.
- What we, as a school community, <u>value</u> as important.
- What we, as a school community, characterise us as a school.

At Porthcawl, pupils are taught in subjects. This is because we believe subject concepts and knowledge are matter. Each subject has an important body of knowledge alongside specific skills, and each belong to a rich tradition that is unique to them.

For pupils to think critically and to form their own opinions, it is necessary to have something to think about. We therefore value a knowledge rich approach, delivered by expert teaching staff.



Behaviour for Learning / Expectations

One of the strengths of our school is the behaviour and attitude displayed by our pupils. This is created by positive relationships between pupils and staff, and through the desire of all teachers to provide pupils with the knowledge, skills, experiences, and desire to thrive in the adult world.

To ensure a positive learning environment we have a 'Ready to Learn' approach at the school. Staff at the school acknowledge positive behaviour and implement a consistent approach to daily 'Standard Operating Procedures' so that poor behaviour can be challenged and dealt with quickly and efficiently.



Our 'Ready to Learn' system is built around respect, powerful routines, and consistent daily habits. We make behaviour expectations very clear and ensure that every pupil is ready to learn, every lesson, of every day. Our systems are built around explicit graduated responses. In assemblies this term and throughout the year we will be discussing our expectations; centred around our motto of "Perseverance Creates Success" and we will be reflecting upon the characteristics we expect in the "Porthcawl Pupil".

ClassCharts is used to record "Ready to Learn" behaviour points.

School Standards

There are high standards at Porthcawl Comprehensive School – both in terms of our academic standards (in lessons and learning) and our general standards (around school site and school policies). Our 'Standards & Expectations' are an integral part of the characteristics, values and routines we believe in within 'The Porthcawl Pupil' and our 'Ready to Learn' approaches (outlined above). High standards underpin all that we do at PCS, therefore these will be revisited and reinforced with all pupils often. We have three very simple approaches for general school standards:

- Standards of Uniform as per school policy.
- Mobile Phones as per policy. Not seen and not heard on school site.
- School Site / Toilets use facilities as intended.

School uniform: There are checks on school uniform, including gate checks at the start of the day, form tutor checks during registration, and on-going monitoring by teachers in all lessons. Pupils with incorrect uniform should expect items to be confiscated until the end of the day.

Mobile phones: Mobile phones should not be seen in school. Pupils seen using their mobile phone in school should expect to have them confiscated until the end of the day.

Toilet facilities in school: During lesson time, A-Block toilets are open to all pupils. In addition, there are separate toilet facilities open for the Sixth Form. The use of our toilet facilities is monitored by staff throughout the day to support the appropriate use of these facilities. At break and lunchtime all toilets across the school site are open, and staff supervision has been scheduled to ensure these spaces remain open and accessible for everyone.

We operate a Daily Detention / Behaviour Reflection system for those pupils who have their mobile phone or an item of uniform confiscated: Daily Detentions form part of our graduated responses to support positive behaviour and positive learning. They provide time for pupils to reflect upon their behaviour/actions. Daily Detentions last for 15 minutes at the start of lunchtime. If an item is confiscated during lesson 5, it will be lunchtime the following day. If your child is placed into Daily Detention, you will be notified through ClassCharts. Failure to attend Daily Detention will result in confiscated items not being handed back to a pupil at the end of the day and a parent or carer being required to come in and collect it.

I thank you for your support in ensuring a positive learning environment at Porthcawl Comprehensive School and for your continued support with all school policies and procedures.

Extra-Curricular Activities

A programme of extra-curricular activities will be shared with you as soon as possible. This will be shared with you via ClassCharts and our 2025-2026 "What's On" brochure. The latter will present the weekly clubs and activities that take place across the school at break time, lunch time and at the end of the school day.

Parents/Carers Visiting the School (during the school day)

If you need to visit the school, please use the buzzer entry system at the front of the main reception building. Upon entry, all visitors must report to the main reception. Please note that teaching staff are not generally available during the school day and therefore it is preferable that you telephone or email via info@porthcawlschool.co.uk in advance to make an appointment. Please can I also ask that parents/carers parking vehicles near the school are considerate to our neighbours. Please do not block driveways even if you stay in your car. This will ensure all local residents can access their properties / driveways.

Drop Off / Collection (Start and End of the School Day)

As a relatively large secondary school, pupils arrive and leave the school in a variety of different ways. E.g. via a school bus, via a public service bus, via a bicycle, via a car from parent/carer/relative or on foot. The vast majority of our pupils walk to and from school. Therefore, if you are dropping-off and/or collecting you child from school I kindly ask that you follow the highway code and do not park / block the pavements surrounding the school site. With approximately 1250 pupils leaving the site at the same time, this will support a safe departure/exit for all.

Attendance & Holiday Leave

Regular school attendance is essential and vital to a good education. Attendance at Porthcawl is comparatively good, but still below our expectations. Improving attendance is an on-going priority for the school. The link between attendance and attainment is clear. If pupils are in school, they will usually do well academically, so we encourage all parents/carers to ensure that their child's attendance is as good as possible. Parents/carers will recognise that both the school and parents/carers have legal responsibilities to try to maintain the highest possible attendance – we therefore need to work together with this aim in mind.

We encourage all students to attend school on time, every day, and aim for 100% attendance. I fully understand that children become unwell, and that there can be exceptional circumstances for absences. However, I respectfully ask that you think carefully before keeping your child off school due to the impact attendance can have on attainment levels.

Porthcawl Comprehensive School is committed to ensuring that every child reaches their full potential, and therefore requires your support in making sure your child's attendance is the highest it could be.

As we start the school year, please can I ask for consideration of the following:

- Ensuring that your child arrives at school on time.
- If your child is ill, please contact the school on each day of absence and indicate the likely return date.
- Ensure that where possible, medical appointments are made outside of school time.
- Ensure that holidays are not taken during school time.
- Notify the school as soon as possible of any absence and confirm when your child returns to school.
- Respond to any letters or telephone calls received regarding your child's attendance and punctuality.
- Contact your child's Head of Year if you are experiencing difficulty in getting your child into school.

Parents and carers are reminded that they should contact the school by 9:00am if their child is not able to attend school on that day. Parents and carers must state the full reason for the child's non-attendance (not just "feeling unwell") and indicate the likely date they will return to school. If your child is absent without an explanation, you will be contacted and asked to provide a reason for your child's absence.

I hope I have highlighted the importance of regular school attendance and please be reassured that we wish to work closely with all families to ensure that every child is successful with their continuity of learning. We want all pupils to achieve their full potential. Any absence affects a child's progress in school and regular absence will seriously impact on your child's potential to achieve. Please be aware that holiday leave during term time is not encouraged as any absence will affect your child's educational progress and attainment. Please contact the school if any such absences are planned. Only in exceptional circumstances, and only if your child has good attendance, will a request for holiday leave be granted.

To reinforce the importance of attendance and punctuality we operate a 'Late on the Gate' system. Each morning, staff are on duty at the main school entrances/gates to welcome and greet pupils. At the same time, staff are monitoring standards of uniform whilst also monitoring punctuality. We acknowledge that on occasion there will be unforeseen circumstances that can cause a pupil to be late to school. However, patterns of regular 'lateness' will be challenged. If a pupil is late to school on two occasions in a given week, they are issued with a detention.

I am very grateful for your support in ensuring your child is fully prepared for a return to school in September.

School Site / Premises Work

During the summer break several installation works have been completed across the school site. I would like to thank our Premises Team who have overseen the completion of this scheduled works over the summer term and/or holiday period.

To provide a brief update about some of the works completed:


- **Swimming Pool** new changing room facilities have been installed in the swimming pool. This includes new changing cubicles, toilets, changing areas, showers a full refurbishment. During the summer, the final works were completed. This included the installation of new external doors and glass paneling.
- **Identified classrooms** a number of learning areas and recreational spaces have been redecorated. To include painting and new carpets.
- **ICT updates/upgrades** several classrooms, learning spaces and designated ICT facilities have been upgraded with new computers.
- Classrooms new soundbars have been installed in identified classrooms across the school.
- **Sports Hall** during the summer holiday building work started on the Sports Hall. This facility is being refurbished, which will result in new external cladding, heating and lighting. In addition, to support energy efficiency, solar cells are being installed onto the new roof. Once complete the facility will return to school and community use.
- To provide an update:
 - There is a large scaffolding frame set up to enable contractors to complete the necessary work. This will continue to be set up in early September.
 - This building work will continue through September and October, with a projected completion date of October half term.
 - Whilst this work is being completed, pupils/staff will not be able to enter or exit this side of the school site and there will be no access and/or use of this facility.
 - Therefore, for safety reasons this area of the school site is closed to pupils, staff and visitors.
 - Staff will talk to pupils about this work in year group assemblies.
 - Contractors have created a secure, safe area with fencing and the map / image below shows the area that is out of bounds.
 - Weather permitting, pupils will be able to use the field spaces in school, however the area marked off will be out-of-bounds.

I am hopeful that the project will be completed as per the planning schedule and the facility will be back in use for the second half of the autumn term. The images below show where the framework / building work has been set up as per 31st August 2025.









All completed work looks excellent and form part of our continued efforts to ensure the school site is continually modernised and updated to provide the best possible facilities for pupils and staff. I will provide further updates about the Sports Hall progress as we move through the term ahead.

School Improvement Plan 2023-2026

Our School Improvement Plan (SIP) reflects the needs of all stakeholders, pupils, parents/carers and staff. The core purpose of the plan and the school is to receive the best educational outcomes for every learner. The plan is also the vehicle by which we deliver the core aims of our school.
